

### **DEACON'S CORNER**

Do we know the origins of Pride? June has become the month of rainbow flags (and now many new flags that represent all aspects of the LGBTQ+ community), a time for festivals, music, and parties.

But on the hot night of June 28, 1969, in New York's Greenwich Village, it was an entirely different vibe. There was a riot at a dive bar called the Stonewall Inn. Police were in the habit of raiding gay bars and arresting everyone. In those days it was illegal for same sex couples to dance with each other. It was illegal for someone to dress in a way not compatible with their gender.

Arrests and roundups were a way of life. On this night in 1969, the unexpected happened. The gay patrons of the Stonewall Inn fought back. They actually locked some of the raiding police inside the bar and ran onto the street. They then rioted on the streets of Greenwich Village. A few nights later there was an organized march from the Village to Central Park. This ad hoc rally and march became the annual Heritage of Pride March, which happens every year in New York on the last Sunday of June

There is a great documentary titled "Stonewall Uprising," that quotes a Stonewall veteran: "No one expected us to fight for ourselves. We were the lowest of the low."

In 2024, I marvel, and am so grateful, for how things have changed. Shame has transformed into Pride. Once upon a time, Pride was only celebrated in New York City, or other big cities. Now we have a number of towns and villages right here in Westchester that offer celebrations.

Ossining will be raising its Pride flag on Wednesday, June 5<sup>th</sup>, at 4:00 PM. On Sunday, June 9, Tarrytown has its Out Street Fest. Grace is teaming up with Christ Church San Marcos (43 South Broadway, Tarrytown) to have a Pride Evensong. I have invited members of the LOFT's Pride Chorus to join us in song. I am inviting everyone to join us for song and prayer.

We will be having two music rehearsals at Christ Church San Marcos for those who want to be part of the choir: Wednesday, June 5<sup>th</sup>, at 7:15 PM, and Sunday, June 9<sup>th</sup>, at 3:00 PM.

### **EVENING GRACE**






### GRACE CHURCH PICNIC JUNE 23<sup>RD</sup>!
