HAPPY FOURTH OF JULY, EVERYONE!

We had a very successful program year!. Congratulate yourself! We capped it off last weekend with our most successful Art & Action event yet in the three years we've experimented with it with our friends at Bethany Arts Community (BAC) and ENU Builds. Over last weekend, we had more than 300 visitors come to Grace's Trinity campus to experience the different visual and vocal artists, including the wonderful Ossining Sings! concert raising money for Neighbors Link.

And that's not the end of the recent good news for Grace!



Along with local clergy, I met with Bishop Matt on June 25th in Tarrytown and learned that, according to the new diocesan assessment formula, Grace's diocesan assessment will go DOWN for 2025 and following. Wonderful! Also, last Monday, June 30th, I met with Bishop Matt, Canon Alissa Newton, and other priests at Trinity Wall Street to discuss the success we are having in our parishes and what indicators we are using to measure the success. Bishop Matt and his staff are serious about creating new indicators to measure parish health, wellness, and success, and it was a privilege to be invited to that enlivening conversation.

Speaking of success, I have two more great things to share with you.

First, the vestry has chosen a company to compile all our deferred maintenance, repair, and facility assessment data at both campuses so we can eventually do an assessment of St. Paul's and Trinity. The firm is Parish Property Management (also known as PPM) from Pelham, NY (<https://parishmgt.com>). They are the firm our diocese uses for all its property issues. PPM is going to perform a Level 2 Facility Conditions Assessment of both the St. Paul's and Trinity campuses, and that includes the following:

- Inspect the various building systems and provide ratings of each system.
- Identify and photograph major deficiencies which require repair/replacement.
- Forecast and schedule (triage) of capital repairs and their respective costs over the next 5-10 years.
- Hyperlinks to photographs depicting the systems and their respective deficiencies.
- Provide an Executive Summary describing the various systems and their relative condition. The Executive Summary also includes a Facility Conditions Index¹ (FCI) rating of the entire building.

We expect PPM to finish the Level 2 Facility Conditions Assessment reports by the fall.

Second, the vestry, after months of discussion and investigation, has chosen the Open Door New Futures (ODNF) program from the Episcopal Diocese of Long Island to follow for Grace's discernment of its future. It is. You can learn about it here: <https://www.dioceseli.org/open-doors-new-futures>. While our diocese's use of the College of Congregational Development (CCD) model is highly compatible with ODNF — indeed, I'm going to the CCD training this month from July 13-18 in Astoria — it will be years before CCD is fully implemented in our diocese and time is of the essence for Grace.

Additionally, we have hired the Rev. Canon Claire Woodley -- who has lived in Ossining for decades and oversaw ODNF for the Diocese of Long Island for years before her recent retirement — as a consultant to help Grace implement ODNF successfully. While retired, Rev. Claire still consults for ODNF because she is passionate about its successful outcomes.

The question Rev. Claire will lead Grace to answer is: What is God now calling Grace to do? A campus is but a tool, and all tools serve a purpose: What is God calling Grace to be and do from this time forward? Once we can answer together that question, then we can answer together the campus question.

We are going to be doing a lot of discernment together as a community starting in the fall. To learn more about the art and skill of spiritual discernment, buy a copy of *Grounded in God: Listening Hearts Discernment for Group Deliberations* (Revised Edition) by Suzanne G. Finally, keep praying the discernment prayer for Grace that we created months ago and have been praying at Sunday services weekly:

Almighty and everliving God, source of all wisdom and understanding, be present with us as we take counsel for the renewal and mission of Grace Church. Teach us in all things to listen to the Holy Spirit and seek first your honor and glory. Guide us to perceive what is right, and grant us both the courage to pursue it and the grace to accomplish it; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Rest this summer, Beloved. We have important work to do together in the fall.

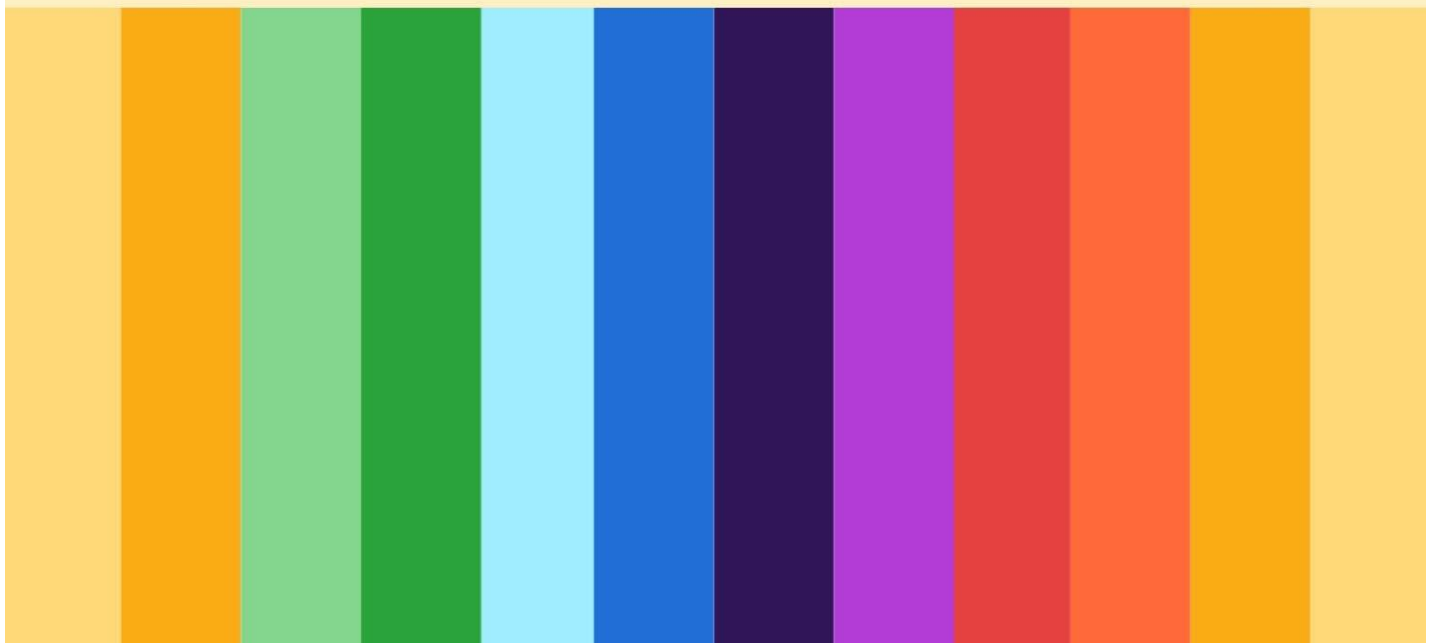

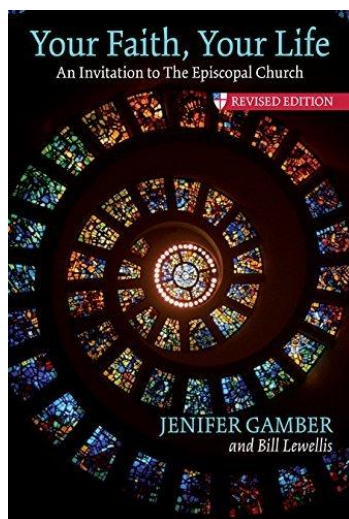

THE GRIEF GROUP welcomes anyone in the community who may be seeking support because of the loss of a loved one, or any other life changing event.

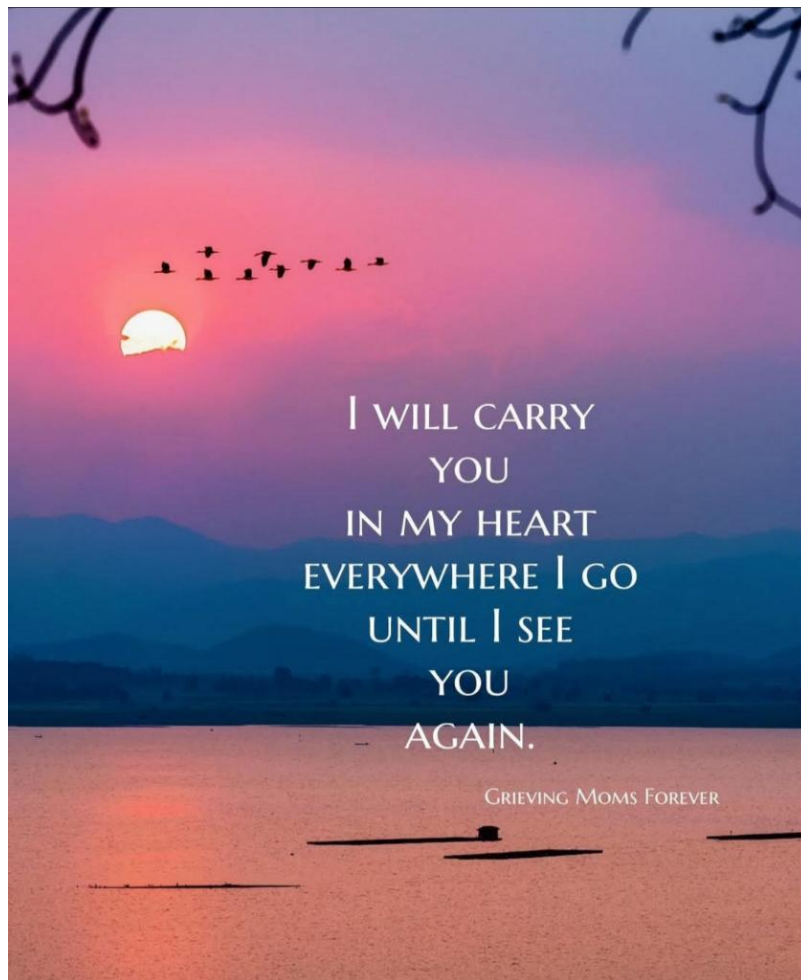

VIGIL FOR IMMIGRANTS AND REFUGEES, June 18, 2025

Our Vigil for Immigrants and Refugees, part of a national effort spearheaded by the Jewish refugee service agency HIAS and a range of faith organizations, including Episcopal Migration Ministries, was very successful. Close to 60 community members gathered on the front lawn of the church of St. Barnabas In Irvington, including Westchester County Legislator David Imamura.

We participated in a ritual that included lighting eight candles, each representing a different group of vulnerable people whom we remember and stand with at this time of danger and uncertainty. And we shared a list of "advocacy asks," naming policy changes we support that will help the united states return to its traditional role as a beacon of freedom to the world.
