Grace has hit the ground running in September and we are off to a GREAT start! As you recall, we had our "Backpack, Grandparent, and BBQ Blessings" Sunday service on September 10th to jump start the program year with a vestry retreat also in September. We also celebrated a wedding for a couple outside of Grace who were married last Saturday at our St. Paul's campus.

In October, we are keeping the momentum going! We just did two pet blessing services, for instance, last Sunday at both our Trinity and St. Paul's campuses.



Also, last Tuesday, Bishop Shin held the first of what will be quarterly meetings for all the churches in the diocese who are merging and collaborating, and he asked us to be the host for that diocesan meeting. We gratefully accepted and hosted a terrific meeting. As I said to you when I applied to Grace, the diocese and I see Grace as a leader in a merger trend that many

others in the diocese will be following, and it is heartening that the diocese views us as leaders in that regard.

This Sunday, Bishop Shin returns to not only worship with us but also to celebrate Deacon Dorothée's many transitions: into her employment retirement, into a new home with her husband, and into a new phase of her diaconal life. Come join us live or on livestream this Sunday at 10:30 AM at our St. Paul's campus as we thank her and celebrate her for her years of bountiful and faithful ministry to many people and churches within greater Ossining.

October marks the start of our stewardship campaign and you will get information soon about how you can support Grace with your prayers, involvement, and financial support.

Please mark your calendars for Sunday, October 29<sup>th</sup>. That will be our next "Fifth Sunday" to be held at our St. Paul's campus and the focus is a "Grace Parish 6-Month Update." The vestry has decided to continuously report to the parish on the financial and missional state of the parish every six months – once a year at the annual meeting and then six months later on the October 5th Sunday. Come learn more, ask questions, and make suggestions about how we can move Grace forward into its next level of integration. That meeting will be held in the Parish Hall after our 10:30 AM worship.

Finally, also mark your calendars for Sunday, November 12<sup>th</sup>. That will be our new Pledge Sunday service at St. Paul's. On that day, we also shall celebrate Grace's 2<sup>nd</sup> anniversary, which corresponds with the time Grace was officially announced and recognized by the Diocese of New York.

There are lots more great things to celebrate at Grace -- and you can learn about them in the rest of this monthly newsletter. In the meantime, keep up your prayers, participation, and support for Grace. You make a difference, and, together, we make a difference for many in Ossining.

Evening Grace is a new bi-weekly lay-led spiritual service based on quiet meditation and alternate forms of worship including movement, chanting, walking meditation, etc. We meet the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursdays of each month.
