As we make the turn into November, we enter a time of continuous thanksgiving. Last week, for example, we gave thanks for our Grace Saints and will celebrate them now on an annual basis. This Sunday, we give thanks for Grace's existence, celebrating the third anniversary of our merged parish and our pledges to keep it going. This weekend, Beth, Cecilia, and I will attend our annual diocesan convention representing Grace and, on Friday afternoon, we will sit on a special panel convened by Bishop Shin to share with the diocese the joys and challenges of being a merged church. Saturday, November 23rd, we celebrate another Grace Friendsgiving Dinner, so come and bring friends. And many of us will celebrate the national Thanksgiving holiday a few days later.

We have even more to be thankful for. In addition to our existing tenants, we have a new tenant renting Grace's St. Paul's sanctuary on Sunday evenings for \$1,000/month; we have had some other nibbles on some of the space we have listed with our commercial realtor; we have helped nonprofits live out their mission to promote the common good by sharing our space; the Ossining police and their Community Advisory Group recently used Grace's St. Paul's campus for a community meeting; and Open Door is going to give away free toys to their clinic attendees at our Trinity campus.

Thanks be to God! We are a parish that walks the walk and lives out our mission statement: "to love God is a call to action." See all that is going on -- just this month! Identify what activities and events interest you and consider becoming involved. Groups are always looking for new members and it's always fun to make new or closer friends.

I close with a prayer from our Book of Common Prayer entitled For Our Country:

For the better part of this year, Election 2024 has been the main focus of the National Church's Election Activators Committee. I participated in this committee's work by posting and sharing voting rights resources in our various publications, including *Grace Notes*. Election Activators acknowledges that this is a time of great national political divide, which will continue regardless of the outcome of voting on November 5th.

For this reason, The Episcopal Church's Office of Government Relations is offering Election Night Virtual Prayers from 8:00–10:00 PM on November 5th. You can join via Zoom by registering here or click here for the Facebook Live version. Bishop Sean Rowe, who became our Presiding Bishop on November 1, will offer an opening reflection and prayer. Episcopalians from around the church will hold silence and lead participants in prayers together for peace, the nation, and all people and countries. For those needing interpretation between English and Spanish, please plan to join via Zoom.

Other events are sure to follow. At this time, we continue to search for common ground and productive paths to bring peace and productive solutions to our community and to our nation.

Thank you to all who have brought in prescription pill bottles for our ministry. To date, I have sent out six full boxes and am working on Box Seven. That is one full box going out every other month. These go to Matthew 25 Ministries, based in Ohio, which sends them to nonprofit medical facilities. Thank you, Beth Pollack, for purchasing two large and colorful bags for storage.


