Ahhh Advent! I LOVE Advent – the colors, the stories, the special traditions, and, perhaps most of all, the explicit permission to slow down and be more introspective. Advent is primarily a season of preparation, not penitence, and thus the Church changed the colors decades ago from Lenten purple to Advent sky blue. Advent invites us to sweep out the manger of our own hearts so the Holy Spirit can be born fresh and new in us this season. Yes, even in the lowly, little old inn of an us. What does that mean for you this year?

There are many ways for us to enhance this interior Advent focus at Grace, and this newsletter will highlight some of them. This Saturday, for instance, at Grace's St. Paul's campus at 10:00 AM, we'll celebrate our "quiet Advent" service for those grieving any kind of loss: loss of a spouse or friend, loss of health, loss of a job — indeed loss of anything. Come join us as we sing classic Christmas hymns that recognize grief and worry as normative parts of the Advent season.

Don't forget there are other great Episcopal resources for Advent out there that you can access for free. One, for instance, is the Advent prayer program produced by Episcopal Relief and Development. "Episcopal Relief and Development?" you ask. "Isn't that the disaster relief program for The Episcopal Church?" Yes, it is, and their work is grounded in a theological framework and so they produce very good theological reflections and prayers for Advent each year that you can sign up to receive for free.

Each year, Forward Movement creates an online Advent calendar that features a daily prompt word selected from the Sunday Lectionary readings. I have been participating for years and have found it a very meaningful daily practice.


AdventWord inspires followers of Jesus with an accessible and creative daily prayer practice. During this holy, busy season, disciples are invited to find small moments of reflection to stay connected to their personal faith, to others, and to God. Email subscribers and social media followers will receive a daily meditation (in English and Spanish) and visual image inspired by the day's word, and are invited to

share their own personal reflections, art, poetry, or other creative expression. If you have a social media account, such as Facebook or Instagram, simply post a photo, a phrase, or comment that relates to the word. Be sure to tag "adventword" so that your post is searchable. It is also a great way to see all the creative and reflective ways others are responding to the word of the day. Click here to sign up.





Breaking Silence: Changing the Culture of Rape and Sexual Assault

Sexual assault remains a deeply entrenched issue, disproportionately affecting women and marginalized communities. Preventing and addressing harm is compounded by societal norms that silence victims, uphold rape myths, and perpetuate a culture of impunity. In commemoration of the 16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence, the Episcopal Diocese of New York Task Force on Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault is pleased to present "Breaking Silence: Changing the Culture of Rape and Sexual Assault." The Rev. Dr. Danielle Tumminio Hansen will lead a conversation with philosopher and author Dr. Linda Martín Alcoff, activist Ms. Amanda Clelland, and author and activist Mr. Ted Bunch to address the pervasive issues surrounding rape and sexual violence and how we can foster cultural and systemic change to create a safer, more equitable society.

The webinar will help to dismantle these narratives by examining the intersections of power, gender, and systemic injustice that fuel this culture. Panelists will explore how faith communities, secular institutions, and cultural norms have contributed to this silence and what steps can be taken to foster more supportive and empowering environments for survivors to heal and for future harm to be prevented. They will also address current news stories about rape and sexual assault.


