VESTRY UPDATE

The Vestry met twice in March, on March 2nd and March 23rd. Our first meeting set the stage for the work we will do together and our first order of business was designating our Clerk, Mark Monroe, and Treasurer, Kate Pendzuk. We thank them both for stepping forward in their respective roles. We spent time getting to know each other, presenting short biographies of ourselves. We are fortunate to have an accomplished group with many varied gifts to share and serve Grace. Topics discussed involved our monthly financial summary, the role of a vestry person, the importance for transparency and decision making, our committee organizations, and on-going projects at both campuses.

Our second meeting introduced two specific items, a Buildings & Grounds Punch List for both campuses and a Vestry Update, which captures and tracks the many items, requests, and projects that come to the warden's attention weekly. Some of the vestry updates with respect to the Diocese include our Parochial Report, an opportunity to provide input on the next Bishop (yes, there's a Diocesan Search going on, too!), applying for a Diocesan Grant for repairs/restoration, and providing the Diocese with input into our energy use/carbon reduction as part of the Diocesan Green Initiative. Other business included applying for a Westchester County grant, COVID protocols going forward, and updates from the Search Committee and our Supply Priest.

TAKING CARE OF THE EARTH



As we begin April, we enter a period of rebirth and renewed hope with the arriving Spring. Earth Day is a large part of that. Essentially the beginning of modern environmentalism, it was started in 1970 as a response to the 1969 Santa Barbara oil spill that created an oil slick in the Pacific covering hundreds of square miles. This heightened awareness kicked off a period of substantial action including the creation of the Environment Protection Agency, passage of the

Clean Air Act, Clean Water Act, Endangered Species Act, Marine Mammal Protection Act, and the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act as well as the creation and designation of Superfund sites requiring intensive cleaning and repair.

This April 22nd marks the 52nd anniversary of Earth Day. In recent years there has been an emphasis on thinking and acting locally and there are many things you can do both on Earth Day or throughout the year that can make a difference in both the Town and Village of Ossining. Stash the Trash Ossining is an organization started in 2020 by local resident Aaron Spring that conducts weekly trash cleanups of places around the village of Ossining. A onceweekly cleanup lasting approximately 45-50 minutes can end up removing tons of litter from our streets and land every year. Riverkeeper is an Ossining-based non-profit that conducts cleanups of rivers and streams throughout New York State. Their 11th Annual day of Service for the Hudson River, the Riverkeeper Sweep, is scheduled for Saturday, May 7, 2022. Last year they coordinated over 100 projects throughout the region to clear nearly 30 tons of garbage from the water and banks of the Hudson River, its tributaries, and other waterways. SEARCH COMMITTEE UPDATE



A second round of interviews is likely as we carefully and prayerfully narrow our selection process. Our goal is to provide the vestry with our recommendations as quickly as possible, making sure to take the time necessary to find the right priest for Grace Church.
