After college, he traveled to New Orleans, where he taught religion at a Roman Catholic high school for two years before earning a clinical social work degree from Tulane University. He practiced as an elementary and middle school social worker and administrator for many years in private and public schools in New Orleans.

His wife Lori has been an educator for over thirty years, and she is currently the middle school principal of the Birch Wathen Lennox private school in Manhattan. They have been married since 1995. They have one daughter, Lily, who recently graduated from Centre College in Kentucky, lives in Louisville, and works for Archetype, a global public relations firm.

As New Orleanians, Fr. Hal, Lori, and Lily went through hurricane Katrina in 2005, and as a result of that experience, Hal discerned a call to the Episcopal priesthood. He earned a master's in divinity degree from Yale Divinity School and a diploma in Anglican studies from the Berkeley Divinity School at Yale in 2013. Fr. Hal has served three congregations in Connecticut and New York and both he and Lori feel blessed to be joining Grace and to be living again in a small town like Ossining, which reminds them of their beloved neighborhood in New Orleans.

A REPORT ON GRACE'S INVESTMENT PORTFOLIO

Richard Shaw, co-chair of our Investment Committee, sent the following to inform us on what drove last year's results, provide their market outlook, and describe our portfolio positioning. A full report of our investments will be presented at our February 19th annual meeting.

Last year saw extreme shocks to the global economy, including reopening challenges after COVID, a surge in commodity prices following Russia's invasion of Ukraine, soaring inflation, and an aggressive monetary policy instituted to control inflation, which drove weakness in stocks and bonds.

We expect the aftershocks of these events to dominate in 2023, principally in the form of still-elevated bond yields and inflation. For the US economy, we foresee a controlled slowdown, although a modest recession is also possible as the Fed attempts to slow growth just enough to keep inflation trending downward. We are not expecting a severe recession at this point.

The church's endowment is in a balanced diversified portfolio with an emphasis on equities and quality growth companies. Our forecast for a controlled slowdown or moderate recession with declining inflation suggests that the Fed is close to completing its hiking cycle (the time period between the month of the first increase in interest rates until the month before the first cut in rates), which should allow both bonds and stocks to post positive returns as volatility subsides.



BILL HUNT September 1, 1925 - November 25, 2022

Long-time resident of Ossining, William (Bill) George Hunt II, aged 97, died in Briarcliff Manor on Thursday, November 25th, of natural causes.

Bill was predeceased by his loving wife, Aileen Hunt. He was deeply loved by his children, Barbara, Thomas (deceased), and Scott Hunt, as well as his four grandchildren and one great grandchild.

Bill was a sheet metal worker who spent the last part of his career at Highland Sheet Metal in Ossining, NY, before retiring in 1988. Subsequently, he and Aileen volunteered to help create the Ossining Food Pantry, where he continued to volunteer for many years after its inception. For that work, Bill was inducted into the Westchester County Senior Citizens Hall of Fame in 2007. Bill was also involved in other charitable works in the community, many of which were accomplished through his long-time membership at St. Paul's on the Hill Church.

A memorial service will be held at Grace Episcopal Church, St. Paul's Campus, on Saturday, February 4th, at 11:00 AM.







Our January 15th book discussion on *Moore Street: Growing Up In The Era of Jim Crow* was a robust Zoom Session which included the author Donald Waddell Lahuffman! He was pleased that Carolyn Black had suggested his book for TBC and had helped arrange for him to join us. He was inspired to publish highlights of his childhood, his church, and his community during the 2020 pandemic. He wanted to leave a record of the history and preserve the memory of Fayetteville, North Carolina, which had been a flourishing town during the 1940s through the 1960s. He was very intentional and specific in naming neighbors, teachers, and community leaders. (Our beloved Carolyn was the first name mentioned on his list of

VIPs!) He shared stories about the challenges and discriminatory policies of the Jim Crow era, as well as the importance of St. Joseph's Episcopal Church and the First Baptist Church in offering hope and inspiration to its members. This event was truly such an interesting and outstanding highlight for TBC, it surpassed everyone's expectations. Sherri and Michael Papamihalis are currently arranging to include *Moore Street* and the author to their church's book club this year too!

Our closing reading for this meeting seemed perfect for our guest speaker who added to his legacy with this book:
