Aileen was the Senior Purchasing Agent for the Ossining School District until retiring in 1988. Subsequently, she volunteered to help create the Ossining Food Pantry, where she continued to volunteer until 2018. For that work, Aileen was inducted into the Westchester County Senior Citizens Hall of Fame in 2007. Aileen was also involved in other charitable works in the community, many of which were accomplished through her altar guild responsibilities at St. Paul's on the Hill Church.

A memorial service was held at the St. Paul's campus on April 30^{th} at 11:00 AM.

Eugene R. Mahlau of Ossining, passed away on April 23, 2022. He was born in the Bronx on July 17, 1932 and was the son of the late Reynold and Edna (Olsen) Mahlau. He was 89. Eugene was a graduate of Saunders High School. He married Barbara Banker on November 8, 1964. He served in the Navy on destroyers.

Eugene worked for the City of New York as a Housing Inspector. In retirement, Eugene and Barbara enjoyed volunteering at the SPCA in their Golden Outreach program, taking shelter dogs to local nursing homes.

Eugene is survived by his wife Barbara, daughters Dawn Ellen Mahlau and Alison (Noel) Echevarria, and grandsons, Dylan, Ryan, and Alexander. He was predeceased by his brothers, Reynold and the Reverend Franklin Mahlau.

Visiting and service were at the Dorsey Funeral Home on Wednesday, April 27, 2022. The interment will be private.

JOHN KEVIN PHILIPS May 28, 1955 – January 21, 2022

John Kevin Philips of Monterey died Friday, January 21. His life was one of devotion, kindness, and gentleness. He loved his God, his Church, his family, his friends, and indeed all creatures great and small. Kevin was also an adventurer in that he embraced the world of life with deep love and respect for its beauty and richness. In mid-life he took up scuba diving and it suited him so well.

Kevin was born in Kingsville, Texas, on May 28, 1955, although thereafter and forever he adopted Virginia as his home state. He was a 1973 graduate of Blue Ridge School in St. George, Virginia, and in

1977 graduated from The University of the South in Sewanee, Tennessee. Kevin attended Nashotah House Theological Seminary in Wisconsin, was ordained as deacon in the Episcopal Church in 1982, and served as rector at Trinity Episcopal Church in Ossining, New York.

In 1989 Kevin moved to the Monterey Peninsula. For many years he provided spiritual care for the residents of the Canterbury Woods retirement community in Pacific Grove. He was also involved in many pastoral and charitable activities, including work early on with the Monterey County AIDS Project.

Kevin was preceded in death by his parents, Marian Rhoades Philips and Ronald William Philips, and sister Robin Wilkens. He is survived by spouse Jim Lauderdale and brother Matthew Philips.


