#### **DEACON BEACON**



Last Saturday, Lainie Murrell was ordained a deacon in God's one holy and apostolic church at the Cathedral Church of St. John the Divine in NYC. You may remember she was our mentee in 2021 and 2022. She's a gifted preacher, worship leader, and an outstanding advocate for LGBTQ+ rights among many other gifts. (And there's a full article about her ordination on the next page.)

What is a deacon? I get asked this question by all sorts of people. Even people who really should know! For example, priests! But the good people of Grace have had a deacon off and on for over 17 years! So, most of you understand the diaconate. I served with you when I was first ordained in May of 2006 for 3 years and then had the distinct pleasure to be called back in 2018 by Mother Cooper!

So, what's next for Lainie? Who knows, she's in God's hands. Her work now is to discern where God is calling her to serve and use the gifts that God has given her. We have been blessed to be a part of her formation and I personally have grown in my diaconal call as a result of her. For that I will be eternally grateful.

Join me in keeping Lainie in our prayers as she discerns her continuing call. Remember that we are all called by our baptismal promises, and if you are feeling a call to ministry, please speak to myself or Fr. Hal to discuss it further and allow us to pray with you about what call looks like for you.

And now I ask for your prayers for myself. As you may already be aware, my husband and I started work on our '5-year plan' towards the next stage of our journey together. We started that journey when we moved into the rectory at the St. Paul's campus. Then Rick moved upstate to begin work on our retirement home in Dolgeville NY, 3 hours north and west of Ossining. He and I have lived apart now for almost 15 months! In October, after 22 years serving as a parish



administrator, I will retire from Christ Church San Marcos in Tarrytown and move to live with Rick! Imagine! Of course, this means that I will no longer be able to serve as your deacon. # OUR LAINIE IS ORDAINED!

On Saturday, April 29<sup>th</sup>, in a wonderful service, Lainie was ordained a Deacon in Christ's One Holy Catholic and Apostolic Church. Grace was represented by Fr. Hal, Deacon Dorothée, our verger Kate Pendzuk, and vestry member Ed Shultz. And the stole she is wearing is Grace Ossining's gift to her on this occasion, beautifully created by Sue Monroe. The call of a deacon is stated very clearly in the words in the BCP that the bishop said at the ordination:

"My sister and brother, every Christian is called to follow Jesus Christ, serving God the Father, through the power of the Holy Spirit. God

now calls you to a special ministry of servanthood directly under your bishop. In the name of Jesus Christ, you are to serve all people, particularly the poor, the weak, the sick, and the lonely. As a deacon in the Church, you are to study the Holy Scriptures, to seek nourishment from them, and to model your life upon them. You are to make Christ and his



redemptive love known, by your word and example, to those ministration of God's among whom you live, and work, and worship. You are to interpret to

the Church the needs, concerns, and hopes of the world. You are to assist the bishop and priests in public worship and in the Word and Sacraments, and you are to carry out other duties assigned to you from time to time. At all times, your life and teaching are to show Christ's people that in serving the helpless they are serving Christ himself."

Btw, the location will always be on the home page of our website (<u>www.graceossining.org</u>) and listed in the Thursday message.




**VESTRY REPORT**

The purpose of the diocesan Anti-Racism Workshop is to help us become aware of how the sin of racism impacts all of our lives, and how we all unconsciously and consciously participate in racist systems. It is required for diocesan clergy, laypeople holding diocesan offices, and is highly recommended for lay leadership.

Dialogue is the foundation of the workshop. We use group exercises and examine scientific and historical evidence concerning the origins of the concept of race and its legacy. Of the hundreds of workshop participants, more than 85% have found the workshop to be "very useful" or "extremely useful" in their work and daily lives.

## Orthodox Christmas in Bethlehem A Pilgrimage to the Holy Land with Bishop Dietsche

In his final year as Bishop of New York, Bishop Dietsche will lead a pilgrimage to the Holy Land that will take you to many places of Jesus' life and ministry, including Jerusalem, Nazareth, the Sea of Galilee and the Mount of Beatitudes, Jericho, Emmaus, and on January 6, 2024, the Orthodox Christmas Day, Bethlehem. The journey will be run by Qumri Pilgrimages, led by Canon Iyad Qumri and his family, who are well-respected Palestinian Anglican Christians in the Holy Land and experienced guides.

#### Departure: December 26, 2023 Return to NYC: January 7, 2024

The land cost of the 10-day pilgrimage is \$2,850 for a shared double room. This cost includes accommodations, including at the lovely guesthouse of St. George's Cathedral in East Jerusalem; meals; entrance fees at sacred sites and honoraria for guest speakers; and tips for restaurant and hotel staff. A very limited number of singles are available for a \$560 supplement. The price does not yet include the costs for air travel and insurance. We are waiting to see if air fares come down a bit before booking travel. In addition, you will wish to incorporate into your budget personal costs, such as for phone calls, special beverages, and gifts you will wish to purchase.

Registration will open in early summer, and a \$500 non-refundable deposit will be due September 5, 2023. Final payment for joining the pilgrimage will be due November 1, 2023.

Yet we wish to begin now learning of you might wish to participate in this special opportunity. Assisting the Bishop with the pilgrimage will be Canon K. Jeanne Person, who has traveled before to the Holy Land with him. She is now creating a list of interested pilgrims and can begin to answer your practical questions.
